THE INDUSTRIAL EFFICIENCY (PHARMACY) REGULATIONS 1938, AMENDMENT NO. 5

Pursuant to the Industrial Efficiency Act 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Efficiency (Pharmacy) Regulations 1938,* Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Industrial Efficiency (Pharmacy) Regulations 1938* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. These regulations shall come into force on the day after the

date of their notification in the Gazette.

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 34, as substituted by Regulation 4 of the Industrial Efficiency (Pharmacy) Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 3, and substituting the following regulation:—

"34. Before any licence is issued there shall be payable for the purposes hereinafter specified in respect of each pharmacy owned by each licensee an annual licence fee of £1 per annum, and an annual levy computed at the rate of 10s. for each £500 or part thereof of so much of the annual sales turnover of the pharmacy as exceeds £2,000."

4. Regulation 4 of the Industrial Efficiency (Pharmacy) Regulations

1938, Amendment No. 3, is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

The effect of the amendment made by Regulation 3 is that the owner of a pharmacy will not be required to pay an annual levy in respect of the first £2,000 of the annual sales turnover of the pharmacy.
