THE INDUSTRY LICENSING (PHARMACY) AMENDMENT NOTICE 1941.

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, I, Daniel Giles Sullivan, Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby give notice as follows :—

1. This notice may be cited as the Industry Licensing (Pharmacy) Amendment Notice 1941.

2. The notice given under the said section 14 bearing date the 4th day of December, 1936, and published in the *Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1936* (hereinafter called the principal notice), so far as it relates to the industry therein described in the following words, namely,—

"The business of any chemist or druggist carried on by the keeping of any open shop or place for the compounding or dispensing of prescriptions"

is hereby amended by revoking the words hereinbefore recited and substituting the following words :---

"The business of a pharmaceutical chemist carried on in any shop or place of business."

3. As regards the industry to which this notice relates, except as modified by this notice, the principal notice shall continue in full force and effect.

4. Except as regards the industry to which this notice relates, nothing herein contained shall in any way affect the principal notice.
