**THE INDUSTRY LICENSING (PULP AND PAPER
MANUFACTURE) NOTICE 1939.**

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, I, Daniel Giles Sullivan, Minister of Industries and Commerce, do hereby give notice as follows:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Industry Licensing (Pulp and Paper Manufacture) Notice 1939.

2. The industry to which this notice relates is the following:—

The manufacture of paper-pulp or paper-products as herein defined.

3. For the purpose of this notice—

(a) “Paper-pulp” means pulp which is made from wood or paper or any other cellulosic material (whether raw material or waste material) and which is suitable for the manufacture of paper:

(b) “Paper-products” means any one or more of the following products of paper-pulp—namely, paper, paper-board, moulded products, and multi-wall paper bags:

(c) “Paper” means a matted or felted structure in a relatively thin and flexible sheet consisting principally of paper-pulp formed from a water suspension:

(d) “Paper-board” means paper in the form of relatively thick and stiff sheets:

(e) “Multi-wall paper bag” means any container the walls of which are composed of two or more sheets of paper.

4. From such one of the respective dates specified herein as is applicable to the case, the said industry shall be carried on only pursuant to a license issued under Part III of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, and in conformity with the terms and conditions of such license.

5. The dates hereinbefore referred to shall be the following, namely:—

(a) In the case of persons who on the date of notification hereof in the *Gazette* are engaged in the said industry the said date shall be the 30th day of November, 1939, or such earlier or later date (if any) as may hereafter be specified by a further notice under the said section 14 given before the said 30th day of November, 1939:

(b) In all other cases the said date shall be the date of notification hereof in the *Gazette*.

6. Applications for licenses from persons who are required to obtain licenses to carry on the said industry on and after the 1st day of December, 1939, must be lodged with the Bureau of Industry, Wellington, at least one month prior to that date.
