THE INDUSTRY LICENSING (HAND-SHOVELS MANUFACTURE) NOTICE 1946

Pursuant to section 14 of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, I, Daniel Giles Sullivan, Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby give notice as follows:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Industry Licensing (Handshovels Manufacture) Notice 1946.

2. The industry to which this notice relates (hereinafter called

the said industry) is the manufacture of hand-shovels.

3. For the purposes of this notice the manufacture of hand-shovels shall be deemed to mean the manufacture for sale or export of hand-shovels, including round-mouthed and square-mouthed shovels and long-handled and short-handled shovels, but excluding trowels, digging spades, and household fire-shovels.

4. For the purposes of this notice, "sale" does not include disposition by retail for valuable consideration in fulfilment of orders

commonly known as "bespoke" orders.

- 5. From such one of the respective dates specified herein as is applicable to the case, the said industry shall be carried on only pursuant to a license issued under Part III of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, and in conformity with the terms and conditions of such license.
- 6. The dates hereinbefore referred to shall be the following, namely:
 - (a) In the case of persons who on the notification hereof in the Gazette are engaged in the said industry the said date shall be the 14th day of April, 1946, or such earlier or later date (if any) as may hereafter be specified by a further notice under the said section 14 given before the said 14th day of April, 1946.

(b) In all other cases the said date shall be the date of notification hereof in the Gazette.
