THE INDUSTRY LICENSING (FISH-CANNING) NOTICE 1939.

Pursuant to section 14 of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, I, Daniel Giles Sullivan, Minister of Industries and Commerce, do hereby give notice as follows:—

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Industry Licensing (Fish-canning) Notice 1939.
- 2. The industry to which this notice relates (hereinafter called the said industry) is the following:—

The preservation for sale in hermetically sealed cans, jars, or other containers of fish as herein defined.

- 3. For the purpose of this notice "fish" includes every description of fish and shell-fish found in New Zealand waters except trout.
- 4. From such one of the respective dates specified herein as is applicable to the case, the said industry shall be carried on only pursuant to a license issued under Part III of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, and in conformity with the terms and conditions of such license.
- 5. The dates hereinbefore referred to shall be the following, namely:—
 - (a) In the case of persons who on the date of notification hereof in the Gazette are engaged in the said industry the said date shall be the 31st day of December, 1939, or such earlier or later date (if any) as may hereafter be specified by a further notice under the said section 14 given before the said 31st day of December, 1939:
 - (b) In all other cases the said date shall be the date of notification hereof in the *Gazette*.
- 6. Applications for licenses from persons who are required to obtain licenses to carry on the said industry on and after the 1st day of January, 1940, must be lodged with the Bureau of Industry, Wellington, at least two months prior to that date.
