## THE INDUSTRY LICENSING (SOAP-MANUFACTURE) REVOCATION NOTICE 1942

Pursuant to the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, I, Daniel Giles Sullivan, Minister of Industries and Commerce, do hereby give notice as follows:—

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Industry Licensing (Soapmanufacture) Revocation Notice 1942.
- 2. This notice shall come into force on the day following the notification hereof in the Gazette.
- 3. The Industry Licensing (Soap-manufacture) Notice 1939\* and the Industry Licensing (Soap-manufacture) Notice 1939, Amendment No. 1†, are hereby revoked.
- 4. The revocation hereby effected shall be without prejudice to the liability of any licensee for any license fees or levies accrued due prior to the coming into force of this notice and without prejudice to the continued application to the Industry Account established for the industry to which the said revoked notices relate of Part VII of the Licensed Industries General Regulations 1940‡.
