IMPORTATION OF FRUIT-CASE TIMBER.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. Act pursuant to which the regulations were made: The Customs Act, 1913.

Date on which the regulations were made: 26th day of August, 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 27th day of August, 1936.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section forty-six of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby prohibit the importation into New Zealand of timber, roughsawn or dressed, cut to size and intended for the manufacture of fruit-cases, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act, 1936. These regulations are administered by the Customs Department. (C. No. 158.)
