## THE INTRODUCTION OF PLANTS PROHIBITION ORDER 1949

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 28th day of September, 1949

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Introduction of Plants Act, 1927, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order.

#### ORDER

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Introduction of Plants Prohibition Order 1949.
  - 2. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1949.
  - 3. For the purposes of this Order,—
    - "The said Act" means the Introduction of Plants Act, 1927:
    - "Plant" means any viable plant, and includes the seed or any viable portion of a plant.
- 4. The Order in Council made under the said Act on the 29th day of July, 1929, and published in the *Gazette* on the 8th day of August, 1929, at page 2025, is hereby revoked.
- 5. The plants named in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be prohibited plants within the meaning of the said Act.

Tourretia volubilis.
Tussilago furfara (coltsfoot).
