THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Stock Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Introduction of Soil Prohibition Order 1952.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Save in accordance with any Act or regulations, or with the consent of the Minister of Agriculture and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose, no person shall introduce into New Zealand any soil, sand, clay, or earth whether by itself or with any goods.

3. The Minister may in his discretion refuse his consent under this order and may delegate to the Director-General of Agriculture or to any specified officer of the Department of Agriculture authority to grant or refuse any such consent, and any consent given by the Director-General or any other authorized officer of the said Department and the conditions thereof shall for the purposes of this order be as effective as if given by the Minister in person.
