At the Government House at Wellington, this 23rd day of August, 1940.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Immigration Restriction Regulations 1930, Amendment No. 3.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Immigration Restriction Regulations 1930* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the Gazette of the making thereof.
- 4. Form 14 as prescribed by Regulation 20 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked and the form in the Schedule hereto is substituted therefor.
- 5. References in Regulation 20 of the principal regulations to Form 14 shall be deemed to be references to the form in the Schedule hereto.
