ORDER IN COUNCIL

The Right Hon. R. D. Muldoon presiding in Council Pursuant to the Industrial Relations Act 1973, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Relations Regulations 1974, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Industrial Relations Regulations 1974* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1983.
- **2. Register of accidents**—The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking form 46, and substituting the form 46 set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

Industrial Relations Regulations 1974, Amendment No. 2

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe a new form of Register of Accidents for the purposes of the Industrial Relations Act 1973. The new form is aligned with that prescribed by the First Aid (Factories) Regulations 1966. As so aligned, entries in the Register must contain the following additional details:

(a) The treatment given to the injured person:
(b) Whether the injured person is referred to a doctor or hospital:
(c) The name or initials of the person giving first-aid treatment.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 16 December 1982. These regulations are administered in the Department of Labour.
