## THE INTERMEDIATE SCHOOLS AND DEPARTMENTS REGULATIONS 1932, AMENDMENT NO. 5

At the Government House at Wellington, this 28th day of November 1951

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Intermediate Schools and Departments Regulations 1932, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the regulations for intermediate schools and departments made by Order in Council dated the 15th day of December 1932\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) Regulation 21 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to subclause (2B), as inserted by regulation 4 of the Intermediate Schools and Departments Regulations 1932, Amendment No. 3.

the following proviso:

"Provided that the report to be given in the year 1953 shall be

for the previous three years."

(2) Regulation 21 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by inserting, after the said subclause (2B), the following subclause :-

"(2c) The Committee elected for every intermediate school and department in the year 1950 shall continue in office, subject to the provisions of the principal regulations, until a new Committee is elected for the school or department in the year 1953."

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general

These regulations provide that every Committee elected in 1950 for any intermediate school or department shall continue in office for three years and that its reports to the meeting of parents in 1953 shall cover the three years during which it has been in office.

Section 3 of the Education Amendment Act 1950 provided for a similar extension of the term of office of the Committees elected in 1950 for public schools.
