



THE INDUSTRIAL TRAINING LEVIES (ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONICS INDUSTRY) NOTICE 1981

PURSUANT to section 4 of the Industrial Training Levies Act 1978, the Minister of Labour hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Industrial Training Levies (Electrical and Electronics Industry) Notice 1981.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Electronics industry defined—For the purposes of this notice the activities of the electrical and electronics industry—

(a) Comprise the activities described in the First Schedule to this notice; but

(b) Do not include any activities so described when carried on—

(i) By a local authority for the time being specified in the Second Schedule to the Joint Council for Local Authorities Services Act 1977; or

(ii) By the New Zealand Government Railways Department.

3. Notice to bind the Crown—This notice shall bind the Crown.

4. Electrical and electronics industry levy imposed—(1) In respect of the registration year ending with the 31st day of January 1983 and each succeeding registration year, an annual levy is hereby imposed on the occupier of each factory in which the activities of the electrical and electronics industry are carried on.

(2) The rates of the levy and the basis on which it is imposed are set out in the Second Schedule to this notice.

5. Determination of factories affected—(1) For the purposes of this notice the factories carrying on the activities of the electrical and electronics industry are the factories in which any of the activities of the electrical and electronics industry are carried on as the predominant activity.

(2) In case of doubt the Secretary of Labour shall determine which factories are, for the purposes of this notice, carrying on any of the activities of the electrical and electronics industry as the predominant activity.

SCHEDULES

FIRST SCHEDULE

Cl. 2 (a)

THE ACTIVITIES OF THE ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONICS INDUSTRY

Manufacture of Office, Computing and Accounting Machinery

1. The manufacture, renovation, and repair of office machines and equipment such as—

- (a) Calculating, adding, and accounting machines:
- (b) Punched-card system machines and equipment and associated electronic data processing equipment and accessories:
- (c) Cash registers:
- (d) Typewriters (except typewriter repairs for the general public):
- (e) Scales, weighing machines (except where scientific apparatus for laboratories):
- (f) Duplicating machines (except photo-copiers):
- (g) Other office machines.

Manufacture of Electrical Industry Machinery and Apparatus

2. The manufacture, renovation, and repair of—

- (a) Electric motors, generators, and complete turbine-generator and engine-generator sets:
- (b) Transformers, switchgear, and switchboard apparatus:
- (c) Rectifiers and other electrical transmission and distribution equipment:
- (d) Electrical industrial control devices such as motor starters and controllers, electronic timing and positioning devices:
- (e) Electro-magnetic clutches and brakes:
- (f) Welding apparatus etc.

Manufacture of Radio, Television, and Communication Equipment and Apparatus

3. The manufacture of radio and television receiving sets and sound reproducing and recording equipment,—

- (a) Including—
 - (i) Public address systems and gramophones:
 - (ii) Dictating machines and tape recorders:
 - (iii) Gramophone records and pre-recorded magnetic tapes:
 - (iv) Wire and wireless telephone and telegraph equipment:
 - (v) Radio and television transmitting, signalling, and detection equipment:
 - (vi) Radar equipment and installations:
 - (vii) Parts and supplies specially used for electronic equipment or apparatus mentioned in any other subparagraph of this paragraph:
 - (viii) Semi-conductor and related sensitive semi-conductor devices:
 - (ix) Fixed and variable electronic capacitors and condensers:
 - (x) Radiographic, fluoroscopic, and other X-ray apparatus and tubes; but
- (b) Not including the work of repair, servicing, and installation establishments dealing with household-type equipment or apparatus.

FIRST SCHEDULE—*continued**Electrical Contracting*

4. The installation, maintenance, and repair of electrical equipment, including telecommunications equipment, and the performance of other allied electrical work, including burglar alarm installation and maintenance.

5. The work described in clause 4 of this Schedule does not include—

- (a) The repair and maintenance in the home of household and personal electrical appliances such as electric stoves, refrigerators, washing machines, and television sets; or
- (b) Electrical, electronic, and telecommunications work carried out in repair shops; or
- (c) The construction of power transmission lines and telephone lines; or
- (d) Subject to clause 6 (a) of this Schedule, electric power plant construction and electric substation construction; or
- (e) Subject to clause 6 (b) of this Schedule, telephone exchange construction.

6. The work described in clause 4 of this Schedule includes—

- (a) Electrical work carried out under a subcontract that is allied to a contract for the construction of an electric power plant or an electric substation; and
- (b) Telecommunications work carried out under a subcontract that is allied to a contract for the construction of a telephone exchange.

Electrical Repair

7. The work of establishments engaged basically in repairing, servicing, or installing—

- (a) Radio or television receivers; or
 - (b) Radio transmitting equipment; or
 - (c) Antennas (including antennas in homes); or
 - (d) Household and personal electrical appliances such as—
 - (i) Refrigerators:
 - (ii) Washing machines:
 - (iii) Sewing machines:
 - (iv) Vacuum cleaners:
 - (v) Gramophones:
 - (vi) Tape recorders.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice imposes an annual levy on the occupier of each factory in which any of the activities of the electrical and electronics industry are carried on as the predominant activity. Those activities (which are described in the First Schedule to the notice) cover the activities described in Groups 3825, 3831, 3832, 5221, and 9512 of the Department of Labour Standard Industrial Classification, April 1971.

The proceeds of the levy are to be paid, following their collection by the Crown, to the Electrical and Electronics Industry Training Board.
