



**IMMIGRATION (TRANSIT VISAS) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to sections 14E and 150 of the Immigration Act 1987, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Immigration (Transit Visas) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1997, and are part of the Immigration (Transit Visas) Regulations 1997\* (“the principal regulations”).

(2) These regulations come into force on 28 November 1997.

**2. Schedule amended**—Part 1 of the Schedule of the principal regulations is amended by inserting, after the item relating to Algeria, the following item:

“(iii) Angola; or”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 28 November 1997, add Angola to the countries whose citizens require, in the circumstances specified by the principal regulations, transit visas before they can proceed to New Zealand as transit passengers.

The requirement for transit visas is necessary to enable the Government of New Zealand to give effect to the resolution of the Security Council of 28 August 1997, which requires all States to prevent the entry into or transit through their territories of designated senior officials of UNITA and of adult members of their immediate families designated by a committee established by the Security Council.
