His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

**O R D E R**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Judicial and other Statutory Salaries Order 1976.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 27th day of January 1976.

**2. Salaries of Judges, Magistrates, Ombudsmen, and Controller and Auditor-General**—The scales of salaries payable to Judges of the Court of Appeal, Judges of the Supreme Court, the Judge of the Industrial Court (not being a temporary Judge), the Judge of the Compensation Court, Judges of the Maori Land Court, Magistrates, Ombudsmen, and the Controller and Auditor-General shall be those set out in the Schedule to this order.

**3. Revocation**—The Judicial and Other Statutory Salaries Order (No. 3) 1975\* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order, which is deemed to have come into force on 27 January 1976, increases judicial and other statutory salaries by \$188 a year (the amount of the third cost of living adjustment provided for in the Wage Adjustment Regulations 1974, Amendment No. 7).
