His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

O R D E R

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Judicial and Other Statutory Salaries Order (No. 2) 1974.

(2) This order shall, in relation to the Judge of the Industrial Court, be deemed to have come into force on the 8th day of March 1974.

(3) Except as provided in subclause (2) of this clause, this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 11th day of February 1974.

2. Salaries of Judges, Magistrates, Ombudsman, and Controller and Auditor-General—The scales of salaries payable to Judges of the Court of Appeal, Judges of the Supreme Court, the Judge of the Industrial Court (not being a temporary Judge), the Judge of the Court of Arbitration, the Judge of the Compensation Court, Judges of the Maori Land Court, Magistrates, the Ombudsman, and the Controller and Auditor-General shall be those set out in the Schedule to this order.

3. Revocation—The Judicial and other Statutory Salaries Order 1974* is hereby revoked.
