His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Judicial and other Statutory Salaries Order (No. 2) 1975.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 9th day of July 1975.

2. Salaries of Judges, Magistrates, Ombudsman, and Controller and Auditor-General—The scales of salaries payable to Judges of the Court of Appeal, Judges of the Supreme Court, the Judge of the Industrial

Court (not being a temporary Judge), the Judge of the Compensation Court, Judges of the Maori Land Court, Magistrates, the Ombudsman, and the Controller and Auditor-General shall be those set out in the Schedule to this order.

3. Revocation—The Judicial and Other Statutory Salaries Order 1975* is hereby revoked.
