- (f) In relation to the Ombudsmen, to the Ombudsmen Act 1975:
- (g) In relation to the Controller and Auditor-General, to the Public Revenues Act 1953,—

His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Judicial and Other Statutory Salaries Order (No. 3) 1975.

(2) Except as provided in clause 3 (2) of this order, this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 9th day of July 1975.

**2. Salaries of Judges, Magistrates, and Controller and Auditor-General**—The scales of salaries payable to Judges of the Court of Appeal, Judges of the Supreme Court, the Judge of the Industrial Court (not being a temporary Judge), the Judge of the Compensation Court, Judges of the Maori Land Court, Magistrates, and the Controller and Auditor-General shall be those set out in the Schedule to this order.

**3. Salaries of Ombudsmen**—(1) The salary paid to each Ombudsman (including the Chief Ombudsman) shall be—

(a) At the rate of \$20,152 a year on and from the 26th day of June 1975; and

(b) At the rate of \$20,841 a year on and from the 9th day of July 1975.

(2) This clause shall be deemed to have come into force on the 26th day of June 1975.

**4. Revocation**—The Judicial and Other Statutory Salaries Order (No. 2) 1975\* is hereby revoked.

This order increases judicial and other statutory salaries, by up to 2.25 percent. Except in the case of the Ombudsmen, the order is retrospective to 9 July 1975.

In the case of the Ombudsmen the order is retrospective to 26 June 1975 (the date of commencement of the Ombudsmen Act 1975).
