PURSUANT to the Licensing Amendment Act (No. 2) 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. This order may be cited as the Johnsonville and Porirua Licensing Polls Order 1954.
- 2. The special polls to be taken in the Johnsonville area and the Porirua area under sections 8 and 9 of the Licensing Amendment Act (No. 2) 1953, on the licensing proposals and the Trust proposals referred to in those sections, shall be taken on Saturday, the 13th day of November 1954.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

This order fixes Saturday, 13 November 1954 (the day of the general election), as the day for the taking of the special licensing polls in the Johnsonville and Porirua areas described in the Second and Third Schedules to the Licensing Amendment Act (No. 2) 1953. Under sections 8 and 9 of that Act two proposals are to be submitted to the electors in each area, namely, that the sale of liquor be authorized in the area, and that, if that proposal is carried, a licensing Trust be established for the area.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 21 October 1954. These regulations are administered in the Department of Justice.
