PURSUANT to section 35 of the Juries Act 1981, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice of the Minister of Justice tendered after consultation with the Chief Justice, the Chief District Court Judge, and the President of the New Zealand Law Society, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following rules.

RULES

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These rules may be cited as the Jury Rules 1982, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Jury Rules 1982* (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules).
 - (2) These rules shall come into force on the 13th day of October 1986.
- **2. Fees and expenses**—(1) The principal rules are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule, and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these rules.
- (2) The Jury Rules 1982, Amendment No. 1 are hereby consequentially revoked.

FEES AND EXPENSES

PART A

Fees

1. The rates at which fees shall be paid to jurors for attendance at sittings of the Court, whether in civil or criminal cases, shall be as follows:	\$
(a) For every day on which attendance is required for a period	•
not exceeding 3 hours	12.50
Provided that the fee prescribed by paragraph (b) of	
this clause may be paid in any case where the Registrar is	
satisfied that the juror, through attendance at Court, will	
be absent from work for a full day:

Provided that where attendance is required after 6	
o'clock in the afternoon but not later than 9 o'clock in

Expenses

The expenses to be paid to jurors for travelling to and returning from any sittings of the Court shall be as follows:

- (a) The actual cost of travelling by public conveyance:
- (b) In special circumstances, where the Registrar thinks fit, the cost of travelling by taxi:
- (c) Where no public conveyance is available, and no allowance is made under paragraph (b) of this Part, if the distance travelled exceeds 3 kilometres one way, an allowance at the rate of 22.25c a kilometre."

These rules, which come into force on 13 October, reduce the fees payable to jurors. As from that date, withholding tax will no longer be deducted from such fees.
