



## THE JUDICIAL SALARIES ORDER (NO. 2) 1979

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 8th day of October 1979

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT—

- (a) In relation to the Judges of the Court of Appeal and the Judges of the Supreme Court, to the Judicature Act 1908, and on the recommendation of the Minister of Justice made after consultation by him with the Chief Justice:
  - (b) In relation to the Judges of the Arbitration Court (other than temporary Judges), to the Industrial Relations Act 1973:
  - (c) In relation to the Judge of the Compensation Court, to the Workers' Compensation Act 1956:
  - (d) In relation to the Judges of the Maori Land Court, to the Maori Affairs Act 1953:
  - (e) In relation to Magistrates, to the Magistrates' Courts Act 1947,—
- His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

### ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Judicial Salaries Order (No. 2) 1979.

(2) Except as provided in clause 3 (2) of this order, this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 8th day of December 1978.

**2. Salaries of Judges and Magistrates**—(1) The salaries payable to the Judges of the Court of Appeal, the Judges of the Supreme Court, the Judges of the Arbitration Court, the Judge of the Compensation Court, the Judges of the Maori Land Court, and Magistrates shall be paid at the respective rates set out in the Schedule to this order.

(2) In respect of any period commencing on or after the 8th day of December 1978, the salaries fixed by subclause (1) of this clause are in substitution for the salaries fixed by the Judicial Salaries Order (No. 2) 1978 and the Judicial Salaries Order 1979.

**3. Revocation**—(1) The Judicial Salaries Order (No. 2) 1978\* and the Judicial Salaries Order 1979† are hereby revoked.

(2) This clause shall come into force on the day after the date of the notification of this order in the *Gazette*.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

The order increases judicial salaries.

The order makes two separate adjustments.

The first adjustment of 10.4 percent relates to the period commencing with 8 December 1978 and ending with 2 September 1979. This adjustment matches an increase applied to State Service salaries.

The second adjustment, which takes effect on 3 September 1979, incorporates in the salaries the amount of the general increase of 4.5 percent effected by the Remuneration (General Increase) Regulations 1979.
