THE KINDERGARTEN REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 1

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Kindergarten Regulations 1959, Amendment No 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Kindergarten Regulations 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) Regulation 17 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a), and substituting the following paragraph:

"(a) She shall be not less than 17 years of age on the last day of February in the year in which she commences her course of training, or in the case of a candidate possessing an educational qualification accepted by the Director as being higher than the minimum qualification required for the time being under paragraph (b) of this regulation, not less than 16 years 9 months of age at that date:"

(2) Regulation 17 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by omitting from paragraph (b) the words "in any special case", and substituting the words "from time to time".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Egret. Candidates for training as kindergarten teachers were formerly required, in all cases, to be not less than 17 years of age on the last day of February in the year in which they commenced training. They may now be accepted for training if they are not less than 16 years 9 months at that date and hold an educational qualification accepted by the Director of Education as being higher than the minimum qualification required. These regulations also empower the Director of Education to specify from

These regulations also empower the Director of Education to specify from time to time what educational qualifications, other than School Certificate or an equivalent or superior qualification, will be accepted as a minimum educational qualification required to be possessed by a candidate for training as a kindergarten teacher.
