# THE LICENSING ACT EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1942 (NO. 2), AMENDMENT NO. 6

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Continuance Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Licensing Act Emergency Regulations 1942 (No. 2), Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Licensing Act Emergency Regulations 1942 (No. 2) (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Regulation 2A of the principal regulations, as inserted by Regulation 3 of the Licensing Act Emergency Regulations 1942 (No. 2) Amendment No. 2,\* is hereby amended as follows:—
  - (a) By revoking subclause (4), and substituting the following subclause:—
    - "(4) If a permit is issued to the holder of a licence under the Licensing Act, 1908, it shall be issued in respect of the same premises as are specified in the licence.":
  - (b) By omitting from subclause (6) the words "may be sold and delivered from one place only (such place to be specified in the permit) and":

(c) By adding to subclause (6) the words "The liquor may be sold and delivered from one place only (which place shall be specified in the permit):

"Provided that the holder of the permit may arrange for the delivery to be made by the holder of a wine-maker's licence from the place and in the manner permitted by that licence as if the sale had been made by the holder of that licence; and where the delivery is so made the sale and delivery shall be deemed for all the purposes of the Licensing Act, 1908, and of these regulations to have been made by the holder of the permit from the place and in the manner specified in the permit.
