PURSUANT to the Land Act 1948, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Land Act Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Land Act Regulations 1949\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the words "unless in the opinion of the Board there are special circumstances which render the giving of such a preference inadvisable or inequitable".

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

Regulation 5 of the Land Act Regulations 1949 provides that where there are simultaneous applications for Crown land and there are two or more applicants who are equally suitable, preference is to be given to a serviceman or discharged serviceman or the wife or widow of a serviceman or discharged serviceman. The purpose of these regulations is to provide that this preference is not to be given where the Land Settlement Board considers that there are special circumstances which render the giving of preference inadvisable or inequitable.
