REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Leased Circuit and Leased Apparatus Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 5 and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Leased Circuit and Leased Apparatus Regulations 1976* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1983.

2. Interpretation—Regulation 2 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of the expression “Minister”, the following definitions:

“‘Packet switching data transmission service’, means a service whereby data may be transmitted between the sender and recipient at various speeds and in various modes through the packet switching exchange system under the control of the Minister:

“‘Packet switching exchange’, means the switching equipment and apparatus operated by the Minister and forming part of the packet switching exchange system provided by him:”.

3. Leased circuits or apparatus may be provided—Regulation 7 (3) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression “2 monthly”.

4. Installation charges—Regulation 9 (4) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “and shall be payable at the time of application”.

5. Payment of charges—The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking regulation 15, and substituting the following regulation:

“15. All prescribed charges for leased circuits or apparatus shall be payable on demand.”

6. Provision and maintenance of circuits and apparatus for packet switching data transmission service—The principal regulations are hereby further amended by inserting, after regulation 32, the following regulation:

“32A. Circuits and apparatus provided for packet switching data transmission service shall be subject to these regulations, except regulation 22 (5), and to such additional conditions of service as may be specified by the Director-General in a contract for the supply of packet switching data transmission service.”

7. Schedule—The principal regulations are hereby further amended by adding to the Schedule the items set out in the Schedule hereto.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS TO SCHEDULE TO PRINCIPAL REGULATIONS

“CHARGES FOR THE PACKET SWITCHING DATA TRANSMISSION SERVICE

NOTE: These charges shall apply to the Packet Switching Data Transmission Service notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Schedule.

Temporary Service

The weekly rate for the lease of circuits, apparatus, and services for the packet switching data transmission service shall be 30 percent of the appropriate monthly rate, with a minimum charge as for 2 weeks.

Outer Area Charge

The following monthly distance rates shall be payable on the length of line beyond the boundary of the base rate area (as defined in regulation 24 of the Telephone Regulations 1976) of the telephone exchange serving the subscriber:

- (1) 60 cents per 200 metres or part thereof for the first 5 kilometres.
- (2) 30 cents per 200 metres or part thereof thereafter.
