ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 16th day of June 1986

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. R. PALMER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 120 (3) of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Less Developed Countries and the Least Developed Countries Tariff Order 1986.
(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1986.

2. Less Developed Countries—The countries set out in the First Schedule to this order are hereby declared to be less developed countries for the purposes of the Customs Act 1966.

3. Least Developed Countries—The countries set out in the Second Schedule to this order are hereby declared to be lesser of the least developed countries for the purposes of the Customs Act 1966.

4. Consequential revocations—The Developing Countries Tariff Order 1976* is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order specifies the countries that qualify for Less Developed Countries Preference (LDC) and Least Developed Countries Preference (LLDC) under the Customs Tariff.

Spain, Portugal, and Hong Kong have been omitted from the list of Less Developed Countries and from 1 July 1986 will no longer qualify for preferential treatment.

Poland has been added to the list of Less Developed Countries and from 1 July 1986 will qualify for preferential treatment.

Date of notification in *Gazette*: 17 June 1986.
