

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (REGIONAL AND TERRITORIAL AUTHORITIES ANNUAL ALLOWANCES AND REMUNERATION) DETERMINATION 1989

PURSUANT to section 214B of the Local Government Act 1974, the Minister of Local Government (having due regard to the changes in annual allowances determined by the Higher Salaries Commission under section 214A (1) of the Local Government Act 1974 and such other matters as the Minister considers relevant), hereby makes the following determination.

DETERMINATION

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This determination may be cited as the Local Government (Regional and Territorial Authorities Annual Allowances and Remuneration) Determination 1989.
- (2) This determination shall take effect on and from the 1st day of April 1988.
- **2.** Interpretation—(1) In this determination, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - "Act" means the Local Government Act 1974:

"Committee", in relation to a council,—

- (a) Includes—
 - (i) Any standing or special committee appointed by the council under section 104 of the Act:
 - (ii) Any joint committee appointed by the council and one or more local authorities or other public bodies under section 105 of the Act;

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- (iii) Any subcommittee appointed by the council or a committee of the council under section 106 of the Act; but
- (b) Does not include a committee appointed by a district community council or community council.
- (2) Unless inconsistent with the context, terms used in this determination have the same meaning as in the Act.
- **3. Population**—For the purposes of this determination, a reference to population in relation to a council is a reference to,—

(a) Subject to paragraph (b) of this clause, the greater of—

- (i) The population of the district of the council, as shown by the last census of population for which results have been published:
- (ii) The population of the district of the council, as assessed by the Government Statistician, on a date subsequent to the date of that census; or
- (b) Where the district of the council was not constituted on the date of the last census of population for which results have been published or has had its boundaries altered by the inclusion of additional land since the date of that census, the population of the district as assessed by the Government Statistician, as at the date of its constitution or the date of the boundary alteration, as the case may be.
- **4. Annual allowances of Mayors and Chairmen**—(1) Subject to this clause, a council may pay to the Mayor or Chairman of the council an annual allowance not exceeding the appropriate amount specified in Part I of the First Schedule to this determination.
- (2) This clause does not apply in relation to any Mayor or Chairman whose actual annual allowance has been determined by the Higher Salaries Commission under section 214A (1) of the Act.
- 5. Annual allowances and daily remuneration of members other than Mayors or Chairmen—(1) Subject to this clause, a council may pay to each of its members (other than the Mayor or Chairman) an annual allowance and daily remuneration not exceeding the appropriate amounts specified in Part II of the First Schedule to this determination.
- (2) The following provisions apply in relation to the payment of

remuneration under this clause:

(a) Remuneration is payable to a member of a council only in respect of each day on which the person attends—

(i) A meeting of the council; or

- (ii) A meeting of a committee of the council where the person is a member of the committee or is required to attend the meeting in the person's capacity as a member of the council:
- (b) No additional remuneration is payable by reason of the fact that a person attends more than one meeting during the same day:
- (c) A meeting that continues past midnight otherwise than by adjournment shall be regarded as having concluded before midnight.
- 6. Additional annual allowances of Deputy Mayors and Deputy Chairmen—(1) A council (other than a town council) may pay to the

Deputy Mayor or Deputy Chairman of the council an annual allowance not exceeding the appropriate percentage specified in Part III of the First Schedule to this determination of—

- (a) The maximum annual allowance that may be paid to the Mayor or Chairman of the council under this determination; or
- (b) The actual annual allowance that may be paid to the Mayor or Chairman of the council under the relevant current determination of the Higher Salaries Commission that preceded this determination.
- (2) An annual allowance may be paid to a person under this clause in addition to any annual allowance or remuneration payable to the person under clause 5 or clause 7 of this determination.
- 7. Additional annual allowances of chairmen of standing or special committees—(1) A council may pay to each person (other than the Mayor or Chairman) who is the chairman of a standing or special committee of the council an annual allowance not exceeding the appropriate percentage specified in Part IV of the First Schedule to this determination of—
 - (a) The maximum annual allowance that may be paid to the Mayor or Chairman of the council under this determination; or
 - (b) The actual annual allowance that may be paid to the Mayor or Chairman of the council under the relevant current determination of the Higher Salaries Commission that preceded this determination.
- (2) An annual allowance may be paid to a person under this clause in addition to any annual allowance or remuneration payable to the person under clause 5 or clause 6 of this determination.
- 8. Relevant current determinations of Higher Salaries Commission—(1) The relevant current determinations of the Higher Salaries Commission that preceded this determination were made on the 25th day of January 1989 and determined, on and from the 1st day of April 1988, the actual annual allowances set out in the Second Schedule to this determination.
- (2) Each of the relevant current determinations of the Higher Salaries Commission that preceded this determination was made under section 214A (1) of the Act and was in the form of the determination set out in full in the Third Schedule to this determination.
- (3) The determination set out in full in the Third Schedule to this determination is the relevant current determination by which the Higher Salaries Commission, on the 25th day of January 1989, determined, on and from the 1st day of April 1988, the actual annual allowance of the Mayor of Auckland.
- **9. Revocation**—The Local Government (Regional and Territorial Authorities Annual Allowances and Remuneration) Determination 1987* is hereby revoked.

DETERMINATION OF AN ANNUAL ALLOWANCE IN TERMS OF SECTION 214A OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1974 (AS INSERTED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT AMENDMENT ACT 1985)

1. The Higher Salaries Commission has made the following determination in respect of the office stated with effect from 1 April 1988.

OFFICE: MAYOR OF AUCKLAND.

ACTUAL ANNUAL ALLOWANCE: \$57,000.

2. This determination expires on 31 March 1989.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

- 1. The Commission determines annual allowances in relation to the responsibilities of each office and not in relation to the personal performances of incumbents. Unless otherwise specified in a determination, it applies to both the incumbent as at 1 April 1988 and to any replacement.
- 2. In terms of section 214A of the Local Government Act, the Higher Salaries Commission can determine the <u>actual</u> or <u>maximum</u> annual allowance payable. On this occasion the <u>Commission has decided</u> to determine the actual annual allowance.
- 3. In terms of section 19 of the Higher Salaries Commission Act 1977 (as amended) this determination remains in force beyond its stated expiry date until superseded by another determination, and may on the grounds stated in Section 19 (4) of the Act be amended at any time.

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EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the determination, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This determination, which takes effect on and from 1 April 1988, fixes the maximum allowances and remuneration that may be paid to Chairmen and Mayors of regional and united councils and territorial authorities, Deputy Chairmen and Deputy Mayors, chairmen of standing or special committees, and members of those bodies.

This determination does not apply to the Chairmen and Mayors whose actual annual

This determination does not apply to the Chairmen and Mayors whose actual annual allowances were determined by the Higher Salaries Commission on 25 January 1989. The allowances so determined are set out in the Second Schedule to this determination.

Mayors and Chairmen will continue to be paid only by way of an annual allowance. Ordinary members may continue to be paid a combination of an annual allowance and daily remuneration, and Deputy Mayors, Deputy Chairmen, and committee chairmen will continue to be entitled to an additional annual allowance in respect of their responsibilities.

Apart from increases to amounts, this determination makes some minor changes to the regime set out in the 1987 Determination. These minor changes are as follows:

- (a) Clauses 6 (1) and 7 (1) now make it clear that the maximum additional annual allowances that may be paid to deputy mayors, deputy chairmen, and committee chairmen are percentages of the mayor or chairman's maximum or actual annual allowance under this determination or the relevant current determination of the Higher Salaries Commission that preceded this determination:
- (b) There is now only one category for the remuneration of members of united councils:
- (c) The percentage of the chairman's maximum allowance that may be paid to the deputy chairman of a regional council is increased from 10 to 20.

This determination fixes maxima only and the actual allowances and remuneration payable are to be set by each regional or united council or territorial authority subject to those maxima.
