THE LICENSED INDUSTRIES GENERAL REGULATIONS 1940, AMENDMENT NO. 1.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 10th day of September, 1941.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Licensed Industries General Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 1.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Licensed Industries General Regulations 1940* (hereinafter called the principal regulations) when applied to any industry, except certain industries in relation to which special regulations have heretofore been enacted and are now in force—that is to say, the industries affected by the special regulations hereinafter mentioned, namely:—

The Industrial Efficiency Flax Regulations 1938;

The Industrial Efficiency (Pharmacy) Regulations 1938;

The Industrial Efficiency (Fish) Regulations 1941;

The Industrial Efficiency (Motor-spirits Retailers) Regulations 1941;

The Industrial Efficiency (Motor-spirits Wholesalers) Regulations 1941:

The Industrial Efficiency (Footwear) Regulations 1941; and The Industrial Efficiency (Electric-range) Regulations 1941:

Provided that by amendment of any of the aforesaid special regulations the provisions of these regulations may be applied to any industry respectively affected by such special regulations.

3. The principal regulations are amended by revoking Regulations 7:11, 7:12, and 7:13 thereof, and substituting the following:—

"7:11. An account shall be established in respect of the said industry (hereinafter referred to as the Industry Account) under such appropriate name as the Bureau may select, and the moneys belonging to the Industry Account shall be lodged in a bank account, to be termed the Bureau of Industry Bank Account, which shall be opened at the bank where for the time being the Public Account is kept, for the purpose of receiving the moneys belonging to the Industry Accounts of all industries referred to in a notice heretofore or hereafter issued under section 14 of the said Act in respect of which other provision in the premises is not from time to time for the time being in force.

7:12. The Bureau of Industry Bank Account shall be operated on as the Bureau may direct for the purposes set out in Regulations 7:13 and 7:16 hereof by cheque signed by the Secretary of the Department of Industries and Commerce, Tourist and Publicity, or by an officer of that Department appointed for the purpose by the Secretary, and countersigned by or on behalf of the Controller and

Auditor-General.

"7:13. The Treasury may authorize the establishment of one or more subsidiary bank accounts (under names to be selected by the Bureau), and moneys may be transferred from the Bureau of Industry Bank Account to a subsidiary bank account by cheque signed and countersigned in the manner hereinbefore provided.

"7:13-1. Every subsidiary bank account shall be operated on as the Bureau may direct for the purposes set out in Regulation 7:16 hereof by an officer of the Department of Industries and Commerce, Tourist and Publicity authorized for that purpose by the Treasury.

"7:13-2. No banker or payee or other person shall be concerned to inquire whether the drawing of any cheque on the Bureau of Industry Bank Account or on any subsidiary bank account by persons for the time being authorized for the purpose by or under these regulations has been directed by the Bureau under these regulations."

4. Regulation 7:14 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the words "Industry Bank Account", and substituting therefor the words "Bureau of Industry Bank Account".
