THE LABOUR LEGISLATION SUSPENSION ORDER 1940.

WILSON TIMBER MILLS, LTD., TE WHAITI.

PURSUANT to the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1939, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, do, in order to facilitate the effective conduct of emergency operations arising out of the war, hereby order that the provisions of all Acts and all regulations thereunder, and all awards under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, shall be and are hereby suspended so far as they prohibit or restrict in any way the working of extended hours or relate to the conditions under which extended hours may be worked in so far as they apply to industries carried on at the works at Te Whaiti of the Wilson Timber Mills, Ltd., such suspension to take effect on and from the 17th day of June, 1940, and to continue in force until and including the 26th day of October, 1940, subject to the condition that any extended hours that may be worked and the conditions under which extended hours may be worked shall be agreed upon between Wilson Timber Mills, Ltd., and a representative or representatives of the Auckland Branch of the New Zealand Timber Workers' Industrial Union of Workers, who shall first be satisfied that such agreement is approved of by the workers employed at the said works.
