



THE LAW PRACTITIONERS FEES REGULATIONS 1955

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Law Practitioners Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Council of the New Zealand Law Society, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Law Practitioners Fees Regulations 1955.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1956.
 - 2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 "The Act" many the Law Practitionary Act 1955.
 - "The Act" means the Law Practitioners Act 1955:
 - "District Law Society", in relation to any fee, means the District Law Society within whose district the fee is payable and received.
- 3. The several fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall be paid for the matters therein specified.
- 4. (1) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, the District Law Society shall be entitled to receive all practising fees (in addition to all admission fees as provided by section 12 (2) of the Act).
- (2) Where a practising fee of £7 7s. or £6 6s. is paid, the New Zealand Law Society shall be entitled to receive £1 16s.
 - 5. The Law Practitioners Fees Regulations 1953* are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe the admission fees, practising fees, and restoration fees payable under the Law Practitioners Act 1955, which Act will replace the Law Practitioners Act 1931 and its amendments on 1 January 1956. The fees are the same as those payable under the Law Practitioners Act 1931, except that the restoration fee (payable to the New Zealand Law Society) is raised from £5 5s. to £10 10s.
