THE LAW PRACTITIONERS FEES REGULATIONS 1965

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Law Practitioners Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Council of the New Zealand Law Society, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Law Practitioners Fees Regulations 1965.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1966.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,-

"The Act" means the Law Practitioners Act 1955:

"District Law Society", in relation to any fee, means the District Law Society within whose district the fee is payable and received.

3. The several fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall be paid for the matters therein specified.

4. (1) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, the District Law Society shall be entitled to receive all practising fees (in addition to all admission fees as provided by section 12 (2) of the Act).

(2) Where a practising fee of $\pounds 13$ 10s. or $\pounds 12$ 10s. is paid, the New Zealand Law Society shall be entitled to receive $\pounds 5$.

5. The Law Practitioners Fees Regulations 1961* are hereby revoked.
