## THE LAW PRACTITIONERS FEES REGULATIONS 1978, AMENDMENT NO. 1

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 10th day of December 1979

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Law Practitioners Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Council of the New Zealand Law Society, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Law Practitioners Fees Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Law Practitioners Fees Regulations 1978\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 7th day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.

2. Application of fees—Regulation 4 (2) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression "\$80", and substituting the expression "\$95".

**3.** Practising fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by omitting from the portion of the Schedule relating to practising fees the expression "125.00" in each place where it appears, and substituting in each case the expression "140.00".

4. Transitional provision—Notwithstanding the provisions of these regulations, the fee payable for any practising certificate that, subject to section 24 of the Act, is in force until the 31st day of January 1980, and the manner in which any such fee shall be apportioned and applied, shall be determined as if these regulations had not been made.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase from \$125 to \$140 the amount of the annual practis-ing fee payable by law practitioners. The New Zealand Law Society is to receive \$95 of each such fee. The appropriate District Law Society is to receive the balance of \$45.

The practising fees, and the apportionment and application of the practising fees in respect of the current year (which extends until 31 January 1980), are not affected.
