



**THE LEAD PROCESS REGULATIONS 1950,  
AMENDMENT NO. 4**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Health Act 1956 and section 24 of the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

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REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Lead Process Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Lead Process Regulations 1950\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Washing facilities**—(1) Regulation 15 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "section 62 of the Factories Act 1946", and substituting the words "the Building Regulations 1992".

- (2) Regulation 15 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraphs (a) and (b), and substituting the following paragraph:  
“(a) The sanitary facilities required by the building code set out in the First Schedule to the Building Regulations 1992;”.
- (3) Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclauses (2) and (3).
