Pursuant to the Land Settlement Promotion and Land Acquisition Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Land Settlement Promotion and Land Acquisition Regulations 1968, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Land Settlement Promotion and Land Acquisition Regulations 1968* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Transactions exempted—Regulation 4 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 of the Land Settlement Promotion and Land Acquisition Regulations 1968, Amendment No. 1) is hereby further amended by adding the following subclause:
- "(4) Nothing in Part II or Part IIA of the said Act shall apply with respect to any sale by the Maori Trustee of reserved land to the lessee thereof pursuant to section 9A or section 9B of the Maori Reserved Land Act 1955 (as inserted by sections 155 and 156 of the Maori Affairs Amendment Act 1967)."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations exempt from the provisions of Part II and Part IIA of the Land Settlement Promotion and Land Acquisition Act 1952 transactions for the sale of reserved land by the Maori Trustee to the lessee thereof pursuant to section 9A or section 9B of the Maori Reserved Land Act 1955.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 29 March 1972. These regulations are administered in the Department of Lands and Survey.
