

## THE LEGAL SERVICES REGULATIONS 1991, AMENDMENT NO. 1

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL

### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Legal Services Act 1991, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Legal Services Regulations 1991, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Legal Services Regulations 1991\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
  - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 6th day of July 1992.
- 2. New heading and regulation inserted—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting in Part I, after regulation 15, the following heading and regulation:

### "Other Matters

"15A. Change in financial circumstances—Notification shall be given under section 13 (1) of the Act where—

"(a) The aided person's gross weekly income (including income that is treated, for the purposes of the Act, as that person's) has increased by more than \$50:

"(b) The aided person's capital (including capital that is treated, for the purposes of the Act, as that person's) has increased by more than \$500."

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 6 July 1992, amend the Legal Services Regulations 1991 by inserting a new regulation 154. The new regulation relates to the requirement, in section 13 (1) of the Legal Services Act 1991, for persons who have been granted criminal legal aid to notify the Registrar if their gross weekly income, or their capital, has, since they applied for aid, increased by more than the prescribed amount. New regulation 154 prescribes those amounts. The amounts prescribed are the same as the amounts prescribed in respect of the same circumstances in civil legal aid cases.
