



## THE LAND TRANSPORT (OFFENCES) REGULATIONS 1996

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 18th day of November 1996

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Land Transport Act 1993, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Land Transport (Offences) Regulations 1996.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1997.

**2. Interpretation**—(1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The Act” means the Land Transport Act 1993:

“Land Transport Rules” or “rules” means the ordinary rules made under Part II of the Act:

“Provision” means a provision of the Land Transport Rules.

(2) Every reference in these regulations to any provision includes every provision for the time being in force amending or made in substitution for that provision.

**3. Summary offences and penalties**—(1) Every breach of any provision specified in the Schedule to these regulations shall be an offence against the Act.

(2) Every person who commits an offence referred to in subclause (1) of this regulation is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding the amount specified in relation to that offence in the Schedule to these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1997, provide that breaches of section 4 of Land Transport Rule 32012 (which relates to the responsibilities of operators, repairers, and inspection organisations in relation to vehicle glazing) will constitute offences against the Land Transport Act 1993 punishable by a fine not exceeding \$500.

Land Transport Rule 32012—Vehicle Standards (Glazing) was notified in the *Gazette* of 12 September 1996.

Rule 32012 is the first rule made under the new rule-making provisions in Part II of the Land Transport Act 1993. It is envisaged that these Land Transport (Offences) Regulations will be expanded to provide new offences as new rules are made under that Act.
