PURSUANT to section 65 of the Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Act 1992, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters (Prescribed Foreign Country) (Australia) Regulations 1993.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of May 1993.

2. Part III of Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Act 1992 to apply to Australia—It is hereby declared that Part III of the Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Act 1992 applies to Australia.

# EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 May 1993, declare that Part III of the Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Act 1992 applies to Australia. This means that requests may be made by Australia to New Zealand for assistance pursuant to that Part of that Act.
