**THE MASTERS AND MATES EXAMINATION RULES 1930,
AMENDMENT NO. 10.**

PURSUANT to section 23 of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, I,
Peter Fraser, Minister of Marine, do hereby make the following rules.

Dated at Wellington, this 11th day of January, 1939.

RULES.

1. These rules may be cited as the Masters and Mates Examination Rules 1930, Amendment No. 10.

2. These rules shall be read together with and form part of the rules relating to the examination of masters and mates (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules) made on the 10th day of December, 1930.*

3. Rule 85 of the principal rules is hereby amended by revoking paragraphs (b) and (c) thereof, and substituting the following paragraphs:—

“(b) Two years and a half must have been in the capacity of second mate or third mate of a home-trade ship in charge of a watch whilst holding a certificate either as mate of a home-trade ship or second mate of a foreign-going ship (see Rule 116); or

“(c) One year and a half must have been in the capacity of second mate or third mate of a home-trade ship which is required by law to carry a duly certificated second mate, whilst holding a certificate either as mate of a home-trade ship or second mate of a foreign-going ship; or”.
