THE MASTERS AND MATES EXAMINATION RULES 1940, AMENDMENT NO. 3

In pursuance and exercise of the powe and authority conferred upon me by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, I, James O'Brien, Minister of Marine, do hereby make the following rules.

Dated at Wellington, this 27th day of April, 1943.

RULES.

- 1. These rules may be cited as the Masters and Mates Examination Rules 1940, Amendment No. 3.
- 2. These rules shall be read together with and form part of the Masters and Mates Examination Rules 1940* (hereinafter called the principal rules).
- 3. These rules shall come into force on the seventh day following notification thereof in the Gazette.
- 4. The principal rules are amended by inserting in Rule 9:03, after the number "9:03", the additional number "(1)", and by adding to Rule 9:03 the following additional clause:—
- "(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of clause (1) of this rule and notwithstanding the provisions of clause (a) of Rule 6:14, so long as this clause remains in force a minimum period of six months' service in full or effective charge of a watch in addition to twelve months' service as the junior of two watch-keeping officers on doubled watches, service during both such periods to be whilst holding a certificate as second mate and on a foreign-going ship, shall qualify a candidate for examination, provided that any period on doubled watches shall be counted at the full rate, and if the amount of time spent in charge of a watch exceeds six months, the period which must be spent in doubled watches shall be reduced accordingly."
- 5. The principal rules are amended by inserting in Rule 10:03, after the number "10:03", the additional number "(1)", and by adding to Rule 10:03 the following additional clause:—
- "(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of clause (1) of this rule and notwithstanding the provisions of clause (b) of Rule 6:14, so long as

this clause remains in force the following periods of service in the respective capacities specified whilst holding a certificate as first mate and on foreign-going ships shall qualify a candidate for examination:—

- "(a) Twenty-one months as second watch-keeping officer in ships carrying only two watch-keeping officers; or
- "(b) Twenty-four months as second or third watch-keeping officer in ships carrying more than two watch-keeping officers; or
- "(c) A minimum period of six months in full charge of a watch, in addition to eighteen months as junior of two watch-keeping officers on doubled watches, the period on doubled watches to be counted as fully-qualifying service, and if the amount of time spent in charge of a watch exceeds six months, the period which must be spent in doubled watches to be reduced accordingly."
