



**THE MASTERS AND MATES (COASTAL, FISHING, AND
PLEASURE BOATS) EXAMINATION REGULATIONS 1986,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 19 and 504 of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Transport made after consultation by the Minister with organisations which appeared to the Minister to be representative of owners and seafarers, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Masters and Mates (Coastal, Fishing, and Pleasure Boats) Examination Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Masters and Mates (Coastal, Fishing, and Pleasure Boats) Examination Regulations 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Endorsement to act as commercial launchmaster—Regulation 18 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the word “certificate” where it first occurs, the words “, other than an inshore fishing skipper certificate or a local launchman’s licence,”.

3. Master of pleasure yacht (ocean)—Regulation 19(1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (b) and substituting the following paragraph:

“(b) *Qualifying service*: A candidate shall—

“(i) Hold a certificate as master of pleasure yacht (coastal);
and

“(ii) Have completed not less than 400 hours’ qualifying service in pleasure yachts at sea or within restricted limits over a period of not less than 2 years, including not less than 50 hours’ cruising and coastal experience outside harbour limits.”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Masters and Mates (Coastal, Fishing, and Pleasure Boats) Examination Regulations 1986 in 2 ways:

- (i) Holders of inshore fishing skipper certificates and local launchmans’ licences no longer qualify for the endorsement to act as commercial launchmaster by passing the engineering section of the commercial launchmaster examination.
- (ii) Candidates for certificates as master of pleasure yacht (ocean) are no longer required to carry out 200 hours’ qualifying service while holding a certificate as master of pleasure yacht (coastal). It will be sufficient that at the time of application for the ocean certificate they (a) hold the coastal certificate, and (b) have completed 400 hours’ qualifying service in total, regardless of whether the service occurred before or after the coastal certificate was obtained.
