## THE MASTERS AND MATES (FOREIGN GOING AND UNRESTRICTED HOME TRADE) EXAMINATION REGULATIONS 1961, AMENDMENT NO. 2

Pursuant to the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Masters and Mates (Foreign Going and Unrestricted Home Trade) Examination Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Masters and Mates (Foreign Going and Unrestricted Home Trade) Examination Regulations 1961\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to subsection (1) the following paragraph:
  - "(c) At Lyttelton and Dunedin by arrangement."
- 3. Regulation 28 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting in subclause (1), after the words "second mate (foreigngoing)", the words "or master (home-trade)".
- 4. Regulation 30 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (1) the words "3 months", and substituting the words "6 months".

- 5. (1) Regulation 58 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (c) of subclause (2), and substituting the following paragraph:
  - "(c) Senior courses in navigation at technical or other non-residential schools which candidates attend, in the case of apprentices or cadets, after completing the whole of the nominal period of sea service required to qualify for examination for a certificate as second mate (foreign-going) or, in the case of seamen, the larger part of the service required to qualify for examination for a certificate as second mate (foreign-going) or as mate (home-trade). The maximum remission of sea service in these cases shall be fixed at the time of approval, but shall not exceed three months."
- (2) Regulation 13 of the Masters and Mates (Foreign Going and Unrestricted Home Trade) Examination Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 1, is hereby consequentially revoked.
- 6. Regulation 72 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking Parts V and VI of subclause (2), and substituting the following parts:

7. (1) Appendix A of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from the specimen paper on Practical Navigation for Mate (home-trade) the words "Two hours", and substituting the words "Three hours".

- (2) Appendix A of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by adding to the same paper the following paragraph:
- "4. From the following particulars of an observation of the sun's lower limb near the meridian, find the direction of the position line and the latitude in which it crosses the D.R. longitude: Date at ship 30 July 1958. N.Z.S.T. 12h. 15m. 12s. D.R. position 36° 33′ S., 176° 56′ E. Sextant altitude 34° 39′. Index error 2.0′ off the arc. Height of eye 25 feet."
- 8. Appendix E of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the words "or at the local address of the Red Cross Society of New Zealand".

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general

These regulations make miscellaneous amendments to the Masters and Mates (Foreign Going and Unrestricted Home Trade) Examination Regulations 1961. The principal amendments are-

(a) A candidate for a certificate as master of home-trade ship must possess a radar observer's certificate.

(b) The validity of sight-test certificates is extended from three months to six months.

(c) A mate (home-trade) may gain up to a maximum of three months' sea service by reason of training at Marine Department navigation schools, and seamen sitting for the examinations for second mate (foreign-going) or mate (home-trade) may similarly qualify.
