## THE MANUAL AND TECHNICAL INSTRUCTION REGULA-TIONS, 1925, AMENDMENT NO. 14.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. Act pursuant to which the regulations were made: The Education Act, 1914.

Date on which the regulations were made: 30th day of November, 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 3rd day of December, 1936.

## AMENDED REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Manual and Technical Instruction Regulations, 1925, Amendment No. 14.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made by Order in Council dated 20th November, 1925\* (hereinafter called "the principal regulations"), as amended from time to time by the amending regulations referred to in the Schedule hereto.

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1936.

4. Clause 2 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended by the amending regulations made by Order in Council of the 20th April, 1931) is further amended by adding the following subclause:—

"(iii) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (i) of this clause, the total payment for instruction in needlework shall not be less than at the rate of £10 per annum where the instruction is given regularly for at least one term during the year."

5. Clause 3 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—

"3. (i) Manual-training classes for pupils of public schools in woodwork, metalwork, cookery, dressmaking, and housewifery, and classes for pupils attending the secondary department of a district high school in dressmaking, and in bookkeeping, shorthand, typewriting, and other subjects of commercial instruction approved by the Director, may be recognized if the Director is satisfied that the following conditions are fulfilled:—

"(a) That the classes are conducted by instructors not employed

on the regular staff of a public school:

"(b) That special and appropriate provision is made for the practical teaching of the subjects:

"(c) That the qualifications of the instructors are suitable for the purpose of the instruction for which they are employed:

"(d) That in the case of classes conducted in manual-training centres approved by the Director for the purpose the instruction is given regularly throughout the school year in weekly periods of not less than one hour and a half nor more than two hours:

"(e) That where the periods of instruction specified in condition (d) hereof are not fulfilled the time-table is arranged to the satisfaction of the Director so that—(i) The pupils receive in any one year not less than twenty lessons of not less than one hour and a half; (ii) where pupils are required to attend for a period exceeding two hours and a half, changes of work and intervals for play are suitably provided

"(f) That in all other cases a satisfactory minimum weekly period is observed:

"(g) That approved programmes of work and syllabuses of instruction are followed in each subject:

"(h) That in subjects involving individual practice by the pupils themselves at least half the time is devoted to such

practical work.

"(ii) A pupil doing work in other subjects lower than that of Form I may, with the prior approval of an Inspector of Schools, be included in a manual-training class if he is not under twelve years of age and if in the opinion of the head teacher his attendance is necessary for his normal development and does not exclude any pupils of Forms I and II.

"(iii) All full-time instructors of manual-training classes shall be classified under the principal regulations, and all part-time instructors employed under this clause shall be paid salaries determined in accord-

ance with clause 83 of the principal regulations.

"(iv) Classes in the subjects of elementary agriculture, dairywork, and general elementary science may be regarded as manual-training classes for the purposes of the employment of special itinerant agricultural instructors and for the general purposes of these regulations, and no further recognition of such classes shall be necessary for these purposes."

**6.** Clause 46 of the principal regulations is amended by—

(1) Omitting the words "or manual training" in subclause (i) thereof:

(2) Inserting after the words "elementary science" the words "and for manual-training classes" in subclause (iv) thereof.

7. The sub-title to clauses 49 and 50 of the principal regulations is amended by omitting the words "in Evening Classes".

8. Clause 49 of the principal regulations is amended by—

(1) Omitting the word "evening":

(2) Revoking condition (b) thereof, and substituting the following:

"(b) That each student teacher shall continue to attend classes for his own training and instruction, including in each year a course of instruction in pedagogical methods which shall be subject to the prior approval of the Director."

- (3) Omitting the words "two student teachers" from condition
  (e) thereof, and substituting the words "one student teacher":
- (4) Revoking condition (f) thereof.
- **9.** Clause 50 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—
- "50. Subject to the conditions of clause 49 hereof, capitation may be paid on account of the attendance of approved student teachers while acting as assistants at the following rates per hour:—

- 10. Clause 52 of the principal regulations is amended by omitting from paragraph (b) of subclause (i) thereof all the words after the words "British University", and substituting the following words: "or by passing the School Certificate Examination, or".
- 11. Clause 57 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—
- "57. (i) The allowance payable to a full-time student teacher shall be at the rate of £70 per annum.
- "(ii) A student teacher who is obliged to live away from his home or usual place of residence to hold his student-teachership shall be paid a further £30 per annum as boarding-allowance.
- "(iii) A student teacher who is not obliged to live away from his home or usual place of residence in order to hold his student-teachership may in any year be paid towards the minimum cost of travelling more than three miles each way between his home or usual place of residence and the school in which he is employed as a student teacher by a route approved by the Director the amount up to a maximum of £10 by which his actual and reasonable expenses exceed £4."
- 12. Clause 59 of the principal regulations is amended by omitting all the words after the words "service as a student teacher" in subclause (1) thereof.
- 13. Clause 60 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—
- "60. (i) Every student teacher shall undergo during his period of training a regular and progressive course of instruction in his special subjects. This instruction may be given in recognized classes conducted by the Managers or at classes at a University college or at any institution approved for that purpose by the Director.
- "(ii) A time-table showing the hours and subjects of instruction must be drawn up by the Principal of the school and submitted by him for the approval of the Inspector on his first visit for the year."
- 14. Clause 64 of the principal regulations is amended by omitting the word "term", and substituting the word "year".

- 15. Clause 65 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—
- "65. The Inspectors shall in each visit of inspection to a technical school where a student teacher is employed inquire into the character, scope, and suitability of the instruction given to the student teacher, and shall test by any suitable means the progress of the student teacher in the art of teaching and his fitness for the teaching service."
