# THE MEAT-EXPORT CONTROL ACT (PARTIAL SUSPENSION) REGULATIONS 1940.

GALWAY, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 21st day of February, 1940.

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Whereas by the Meat Marketing Order 1939 made under the Marketing Act, 1936, the Marketing Department is authorized to purchase meat as defined by the said Order and to dispose of such meat for consumption or use in New Zealand or elsewhere either by way of sale or by delivering the same to His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom or to any officer or nominee of that Government:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to suspend the operation of section 13 of the Meat-export Control Act, 1921–22, and to make other provision in the premises:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Meat-export Control Act (Partial Suspension) Regulations 1940.
- 2. The operation of section 13 of the Meat-export Control Act, 1921–22 (relating to a charge by way of levy on all meat exported from New Zealand), is hereby suspended.
- 3. For the purpose of providing funds to enable the New Zealand Meat-producers Board to carry out its functions there shall be paid to the said Board in each financial year out of moneys in any appropriate account established in the Reserve Bank in connection with the purchase of meat pursuant to the Meat Marketing Order 1939\* such sum, not exceeding £30,000, as the Minister of Marketing may approve.
