THE MOTOR DRIVERS REGULATIONS 1964, AMENDMENT NO. 10

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 8th day of February 1971

Present:

The Right Hon, J. R. Marshall presiding in Council

PURSUANT to the Transport Act 1962, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Motor Drivers Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Motor Drivers Regulations1964* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Issue of licences to persons authorised to obtain a limited licence—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 14, and substituting the following regulation:

"14. Where under section 38 of the Act the Court makes an order authorising any disqualified person to obtain a limited licence, the appropriate local authority or the Secretary, as the case may require, on the application of that person, may issue to him a licence authorising him to drive a specified motor vehicle or, as the case may require, a motor vehicle of the kind specified in the order in accordance with and subject to any conditions imposed by the order."

3. Penalty—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 39, and substituting the following regulation:

"39. Every person who commits an offence against these regulations is liable to the penalties specified in subsection (4) of section 30 of the Transport Act 1962."

4. Scale of demerit points—(1) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the Third Schedule (as added by regulation 6 (2) of the Motor Drivers Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 5), and substituting the Third Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations. (2) The following enactments are hereby consequentially revoked:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Regulation 2 re-enacts in an amended form regulation 14 of the principal regulations relating to the issue of licences to disqualified persons with such changes as are necessary in consequence of the new provisions of section 38 of the Act (substituted by section 2

of the Transport Amendment Act 1970) relating to limited licences. Regulation 3 revokes the penalty provisions of the principal regulations. The general penalties for breaches of all regulations made under the Transport Act 1962 are now provided in section 30 (4) of that Act (as enacted by section 2 of the Transport Amendment Act 1970).

Regulation 4 substitutes a new scale of demerit points with such changes are as necessary in consequence of the provisions of the Transport Amendment Act 1970 relating to offences.
