# ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Howse at Wellington this 19th day of November 1979

## Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 20 and 504 of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advise and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

# REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Marine Engineers Examination Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Marine Engineers Examination Regulations 1966\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Nationality—Regulation 22 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:

"(6) Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions of this regulation, the Secretary may extend any certificate of competency issued pursuant to subclause (2) or subclause (2A) of this regulation for 1 further period not exceeding 5 years on application made to him before or after the certificate has ceased to have effect; and, where any such extension is granted, the certificate shall be endorsed accordingly, and subclause (4) of this regulation shall thereafter apply to that certificate.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate the general effect.

These regulations enable the Secretary to extend, for a further period of 5 years, a certificate of competency issued to a person who is neither a British subject nor a British protected person. Previously such certificates lapsed if the holder did not become a British subject or a British protected person within 5 years of the issue of the certificate.
