THE MACHINERY (SHIPS) EXEMPTION ORDER 1963

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 30th day of January 1963

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 3 of the Machinery Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

O R D E R

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Machinery (Ships) Exemption Order 1963.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. It is hereby declared that the following machinery is not subject to the provisions of the Machinery Act 1950:

The machinery of any ship within the meaning of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

Section 3 of the Machinery Act 1950 gives the power to exempt, by Order in Council, any class of machinery from the operation of the Act. This order completely exempts ships' machinery.
