ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 17th day of August 1960

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5 of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Most Favoured Nation Tariff (Tunisia) Order 1960.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.

2. The duties and exemptions from duty provided for in accordance with Part I of Schedule XIII to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, as set out in the First Schedule to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, and as from time to time modified (whether before or after the commencement of this order), and the duties and exemptions from duty provided for in accordance with the Second Schedule to that Act, as from time to time modified as aforesaid, are hereby applied to goods being the produce or manufacture of Tunisia.

3. This order shall not apply in the Cook Islands.

4. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This order continues the application of the most-favoured-nation Tariff treat-ment to Tunisia (which formerly enjoyed the concessions of that Tariff as an overseas territory of France).
