HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5 of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, as amended by section 310 (3) of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Most Favoured Nation Tariff Order 1964, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Most Favoured Nation Tariff Order 1964* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Application of Most Favoured Nation Tariff to Pakistan—The First Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by inserting, after the reference to Norway, the word “Pakistan”.

3. Order subject to section 157 of Customs Act—The provisions of this order shall be subject to the provisions of section 157 of the Customs Act 1966.

4. Savings—All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.
