# THE MOST FAVOURED NATION TARIFF ORDER 1964, AMENDMENT NO. 5

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 4th day of March 1968

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 5 of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, as amended by section 310 (3) of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and, in respect of clause 3 of this order, at the request and with the consent of the Government of the Cook Islands given in accordance with the Constitution of the Cook Islands, hereby makes the following order.

## ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Most Favoured Nation Tariff Order 1964, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Most Favoured Nation Tariff Order 1964\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).
  - (2) This order shall come into force on the 7th day of March 1968.
- 2. The First Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by inserting, after the reference to Brazil, the word "Bulgaria".
- 3. Subject to the provisions of the Cook Islands Customs Duties Order 1962† (as from time to time modified, whether before or after the commencement of this order), this order shall be in force in the Cook Islands.
- 4. Subject to the provisions of the Cook Islands Customs Duties Order 1962† (as from time to time modified, whether before or after the commencement of this order), this order shall be in force in Niue.

- 6. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order applies the Most Favoured Nation Tariff to goods imported into New Zealand from Bulgaria, and extends this treatment to such goods imported into the Cook Islands and Niue.
