ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 24th day of May 1961

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, and the Customs Amendment Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Most Favoured Nation Tariff (Union of South Africa) Order 1961.
 - (2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of June 1961.
- 2. The duties and exemptions from duty provided for in accordance with Part I of Schedule XIII to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, as set out in the First Schedule to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, and as from time to time modified (whether before or after the commencement of this order), and the duties and exemptions from duty provided for in accordance with the Second Schedule to that Act, as from time to time modified as aforesaid, are hereby applied to goods being the produce or manufacture of the Union of South Africa:

Provided that in respect of the classes of goods set out in the Schedulehereto the rates of duties set out in that Schedule shall apply.

3. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order extends most-favoured-nation Tariff treatment to the Union of South Africa after 31 May 1961, except that special rates are specified in the Schedule for certain goods in order to give continued effect to the arrangement made with South Africa in 1947 under the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade.
